- Two positions are up for appointment on the park and rec board, Mayor Ferguson asked that the matter be tabled until he has time to look over the letters from those asking to be appointed.
- Griffin reported that the company that provides trout for the city has a limited supply of trout this year. They have agreed to furnish trout for Lebo. Griffin also mentioned that Sloan had contacted Justin Morrison, with Wildlife and Parks, on whether or not the trout would survive in our pond. Friend motioned and Headley seconded to approve the purchase of trout for \$1,750. Vote 4/0, motion carried.
- Jones made a motion and Headley seconded to approve 2022 annual contracts and dues: *Coffey County Chamber, League of Kansas Municipalities, Association of Kansas Mayors, Association of Kansas Attorneys, KRWA, CCMFOA, IM Design.* Vote 4/0, motion carried.
- Council reviewed a list of 2022 COLA plans from various city’s that responded to Sloan’s request on the city clerk listserv. The CPI for this year is 5.9% as indicated in the list. Council table discussion until information is gathered from cities within Coffey County.


