• Written report for September: One gas tap, water leak repair at Murphy's Ag, north lift station down due to blown Evergy fuse, Bleachers, ropes, trash cans, etc. ready for football season, old bleachers removed from the football field, 24 total utility locates (mainly due to Kwikom & Mt Networks placing fiber lines in town, 1 private sewer, 2 gas mains and 2 water mains repaired due to Kwikom installing their fiber, meeting with contractor for new utility services on s.
